Gems of Europe Lisbon and Madrid

It was on Wednesday 19th August 2015 that our Emirates flight took off from Karachi's Jinnah International Airport at 10:30pm for Dubai. On board the jam packed flight were 53 officials of EFU General's Southern Zone that included the

Zonal, Divisional, Branch and Unit Heads along with the top marketing executives of the company. This year our destinations were two great cities of Europe, Lisbon and Madrid.

After a seven hours overnight stopover at Dubai International Airport we embarked on another Emirates flight that landed at Lisbon International Airport in the afternoon, local time. After a quick lunch at Burger King we checked in at the Marriot Lisbon Hotel at around 4:00pm in the evening of Thursday, 20th August 2015.



Lisbon is the capital and the largest city of Portugal with a combined urban and metro population of 2.8 million people. It is continental Europe's westernmost capital city and the only one along the Atlantic coast.

Lisbon is recognized as a global city because of its importance in finance, commerce, media, entertainment, arts,

international trade, education and tourism. It is the seventh most visited city of Europe. It is also one of the oldest cities in the world and the oldest in Western Europe. It enjoys a Mediterranean climate with warmest winters and cool summers.

After some rest and freshening up we were taken on our luxury bus for the evening excursion tour of Lisbon city to experience the beauty, the sights and the sounds of this lovely city.

The focal point of this tour was a visit to Baixa Downtown that was developed after the major earthquake of 1755. This consists of three main streets reserved for trade, banks, jewelers, arts and crafts etc. From there we proceeded to Comercio Square which is known as the living room of Lisbon. Today it is considered to be one of the largest and most beautiful squares in Europe. It was developed in 1758 in the form of a square opening to the Tagus River and surrounded by three buildings with arches and two monuments along the river. Today the Comercio Square or Praca do Comercio enchants with its outdoor cafes, restaurants, shops and its warm and welcoming yellow stone buildings looking out at the river. From Comercio Square we went up to the nearby Municipio Square which is yet another great historic square of Lisbon built by the Marquis of Pombal in the seventeenth century after the major 1755 earthquake. It is at this very place where after the fall of the monarchy, Portuguese Republic was proclaimed in 1910.

Our first day in Lisbon ended with a delicious Chinese dinner at the Wok Mundo Restaurant, accompanied by some thrilling music and dances. On Friday the 21st of August 2015 which was our second day in Lisbon, we embarked upon yet another half a day tour of Lisbon.

Our first destination was the Monastery of Jeronimos which is considered to be a masterpiece of Portuguese Manueline Art. The Monastery was built between 1502 and 1601 by King Manuel I in order to celebrate the Portuguese Discoveries. On this very location there was a chapel founded by Henry the Navigator and it was here that Vasco de Gama and his crew prayed on the 8th of July 1497 before leaving for the discovery of a sea route to India during 1497/99.

The limestone construction is living example of gothic arches, rose windows, beautiful portals, columns that UNESCO ranked in 1983 as World Heritage. It has a remarkable collection of statues of Henry the Navigator, St Jerome, various prophets and apostles, Kings Manuel I, St John the Baptist beside the tombs of Luis de Camoes the famous Portuguese poet, Vasco de Gama the great Portuguese explorer, King John III and his sons as well as King Manuel I and his sons.

After visiting the Monastery of Jeronimos, our next destination was the Belem Tower which is considered to be the most symbolic and visited monument in Portugal, The Belem Tower was built by the order of King Dom Manuel I between 1514 and 1521 in the famous Manueline style and was designed by the great Portuguese architect Francisco Arruda. In those days this tower was situated on an island in the middle of the Tagus River about 250 meters from the beach of Restelo from where the fleets of ships and caravels used to leave for Portuguese discoveries. However the 1755 earthquake caused displacement of the Tagus River bed and the sands of the beach reached the tower which is now connected to the land by a small metal bridge. It's structure is set on a fortified base of five floors in limestone with beautiful watch towers. It is from here that Vasco de Gama's fleet left for India in 1497 and Pedro Alvares Cabral's fleet left for Brazil in 1500 for glorious achievements that quickly changed the world history and which King Manuel I immortalized in this unique and original Portuguese artistic style.





From Belem Towers, we proceeded to the nearby Monument to the Discoveries which represents a stylish caravel entering the Tagus River, with Henry the Navigator at the prow commanding 32 illustrious navigators, poets, warriors, mathematicians, cartographers, princes and evangelizers of





the cpic Portuguese discoveries in the fifteenth and sixteenth century.

This remarkable monument of limestone was designed by the architect Cottinelli Telmo and was built in 1940 for the exhibition of the Portuguese World. The monument has seven floors consisting of museums and auditoriums.

From the Munument to the Discoveries we took a break for lunch and had some mouth watering Portuguese Cuisines at the famous Churascao Restaurant. After lunch, the bus took us to Lisbon's famous Colombo Shopping Mall which is one of the largest shopping mall of Lisbon offering a variety of items that include garments, cosmetics, confectioneries, handicrafts, leather goods and etc.

The day ended with a delicious dinner arranged at the India Gate Restaurant followed by some strolling around the Bairro Alto and Chiado districts of Lisbon to observe the city's night life

Saturday 22nd August 2015 was reserved for a breathtaking tour of two of the most thrilling coastal resorts of Lisbon, Cascais and Sintra.

Cascais is considered as one of the most beautiful and elegant holiday resort of Portugal. It is surrounded by small beaches, decorated aristocratic mansions, luxury marinas, streets and small squares with some terraces and restaurants and great artistic museums.

Sintra was elected as UNESCO World Heritage Site for its unique natural environment and surrounding mountains and monuments and for the typical narrow alleyways dedicated to handicrafts and to the sweetness of its cakes known as Pillows which are the famous cheese cakes of Sintra. The city has

always been the focal point for tourists and famous aristocrats like Sir Francis Cook and Lord Byron. Sintra's centre of attraction is the National Palace of Sintra that was built in the Gothic Style by Dom Dinis in 1295 over an old Arab Palace. We had the privilege of visiting and closely observing its interior consisting of various halls including the Archers Hall, Maura Hall, Hall of Pegas, Swan Hall and the Barons Hall with beautiful domed roof and monumental kitchen with an amazing conical interior of its chimneys.

After visiting the two lovely coastal resorts of Cascais and Sintra we had a great Italian Lunch at the Pizzaira Divinos Prazer Restaurant and then proceeded to the Free Port Shopping Area which is the largest shopping centre of Lisbon consisting of large shops and showrooms of almost all the top brands of Europe and America offering their products at amazing discounts.

Sunday 23rd August 2015 was mostly spent traveling in our luxury bus that left Lisbon at 9:00am and reached Madrid around 5:00pm covering 500 Km distance with a stopover at McDonald's for lunch. On reaching Madrid we checked into the famous Westin Palace Hotel that used to be a real palace in 1912 and later on converted into a luxury hotel like many other palaces of Madrid.



Madrid is a south-west European city and the capital of Spain. The population of the city is almost 3.2 million and that of its metropolitan area around 6 million. It is the third largest city in the European Union after London and Berlin. It is also the political, economic and cultural centre of Spain. The city possesses a modern infrastructure; it has also preserved the look and feel of many of its historic neighborhoods and streets.

Monday 24th August 2015 was spent in exploring Madrid and our first visit was the Palacio Real which is one of the main symbols of Madrid. It is situated on the same spot where the old Muslim defensive fortress was built. The history of this magnificent building has been eventful. After Alfonso-VI conquered the city in 1080, this Muslim castle became the royal palace of Christian monarchs.

Over the centuries it experienced different reforms until 1734 when a fire almost completely destroyed the palace. Phillip V ordered a new palace to be built on the same site. The work lasted from 1738 to 1755. In 1764 Charles III became the first

monarch to live in the new Palacio Real.

The palace also stands out for its beautiful architecture, for the artistic richness that its rooms presents. Inside one can appreciate the fresco panting of leading artists of their times. It also has a wide collection of tapestries, porcelains and furniture. Among the different rooms that we visited, we were awestruck by the magnificent Throne Room, King's Chamber, Royal Chapel, Hall of Mirrors, Gala Dining Hall, Royal Library & and the Royal Armoury.



Opposite the Palacio Real, stands the main facade of the cathedral of Santa Maria la Real de la Almudena The idea of building a cathedral along side the Palacio Real dates back to the 16th century but was not completed until 1950. The temple is a mixture of neo Gothic and neo Classic construction. It was finally opened by Pope John Pul on 15th June-1993.

After visiting the Palacio Real and Cathedral of Santa Maria, we proceeded to explore other historical monuments of Madrid like Puerta de Alcala, Plaza de Cibeles and Paseo Castellana until lunch at Swagat Indian Restaurant.

After lunch we proceeded straight to the famous Estadio Santiago Bernbeu Foot Ball Stadium which is considered to be one of the largest football stadium of the world. It was inaugurated on 14th December 1947 and has undrgone many expansions over the years. It is owned by the Real Madrid Club de Futbol It has a present seating capacity of 85, 454 spectators and is named after its former chairman Santiago Barnabeu.

We were thrilled by the panoramic view of the stadium from its benches and then experienced the Real Madrid fever while visiting it's history room, dressing room, tunnel, sensations room, photo montages, press room and official store offering a variety of souvenirs and memorable for sale.

Our last and the most unforgettable experience in Madrid was a sumptuous Spanish dinner at Tablao Flamenco Villa Rossa where the famous Spanish Flamenco dance was performed that left the entire audience simply mesmerized.

Tuesday the 25th August 2015 was the day to return home and our Emirates flight left for Dubai at 10:00 PM that landed at Dubai at 7:00 AM on the morning of Wednesday 26th August. Another connecting flight to Karachi touched down at around 1:00 PM in the afternoon thus concluding one of the most enjoyable and exciting tour so far!








Growth of Zones

Based on Premium Performance Upto September 2015 as compared to September 2014









Upto September 2015 as compared to September 2014


